## **NSF 2008 GRFP Competition Now Open**

**Basic Eligibility:** 1. Must be US citizen, national, or permanent resident alien. 2. Earn no more than 12 months of full-time graduate study at the time of application. 3. Must be initiating a research-based graduate (usually Master's) degree in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines supported by the NSF.

**Not Eligible:** Students in the medical sciences, research with disease-related goals, counseling, business, management, social work, education, or history may not apply. Some exceptions, so please refer to the official announcement.

**Award Information:** Fellowships are **\$30,000 annually**, for three years--a total of \$90,000. Each year an additional \$10,500 Cost of Education Allowance is provided to your institution. At MU, this covers tuition, health insurance, and other educational fees. Awards transferable to *any* accredited US institution. the anticipated award notification is March 2008.

**Deadline(s)**: Staggered deadlines run November, 1-13, 2007, depending on field of study.
